SIPSA 2024, A MUST-ATTEND EVENT FOR AGRICULTURAL **OPERATORS**

The 22nd edition of SIPSA has just ended on a very positive note, crowned with success both in terms of sales and technical conferences. On the commercial side, the show generated significant spin-offs for exhibitors, and led to the conclusion of a number of promising partnerships.

The technical conferences also garnered considerable interest by addressing crucial issues and diverse challenges in the food industry.

1- A resounding success in figures

The 22nd edition was exceptional. The figures speak for themselves:

- 720 national and international exhibitors, including 200 new companies from 39 countries.
- 35 000 m² of exhibition space.
- More than 40,000 trade visitors from 66 countries, an increase of 15% compared to 2023
- 2,200 investors attending, reinforcing the strategic nature of the show and underlining the dynamism and potential of the African market.
- 26 African countries represented among exhibitors and visitors.

The diversity of participating countries, particularly from around twenty African nations, underscores the event's continental scope. SIPSA is now more than ever positioned as the leading platform for expertise exchange and business opportunities in Africa and the MENA region.

2- Le SIPSA, a hub for global agricultural expertise: spotlight on national pavilions

Countries like Turkey and France, loyal exhibitors, showcased their dynamism and availability in the agri-food sector through their companies and high-quality products and services.

The Mauritanian pavilion at SIPSA highlighted the country's unique expertise in strategic sectors, particularly its flourishing fishing and aquaculture industries. A true flagship of the Mauritanian economy, fishing and aquaculture were well represented by Société Mauritanienne de Commercialisation de Poisson (SMCP), which offers a diversified range of seafood products of remarkable quality, winning over international buyers in search of excellent maritime products. The active participation of Mauritania helped strengthen the South-South cooperation ties, at the heart of SIPSA.

✓ China's grand return to SIPSA

After a conspicuous absence due to the global health crisis, the Chinese pavilion made a major comeback at this year's show. This eagerly-awaited return provided an opportunity to take the pulse of trends and developments in the Chinese sector, and opened up new prospects for cooperation in the years ahead

This year's event was also marked by the participation of Brazil. With around ten companies exhibiting, the South American giant offered a comprehensive panorama of the country's know-how and innovations in the agricultural and agri-food sectors. Brazilian companies took advantage of this exceptional showcase to create new strategic partnerships and strengthen their presence on the African market.

✓ The Netherlands at SIPSA: Sustainable agriculture and high-tech

The Netherlands, Europe's leader in agriculture, showcased innovative and sustainable solutions to meet the challenges of tomorrow. Their pavilion attracted numerous visitors seeking technological partnerships and exchanges of best practices.

✓ Italy makes its baptism of fire at SIPSA

Last but not least, Italy's first appearance at the show was a memorable one for professionals, thanks to the technical ingenuity of the products on display and the excellence of "Made in Italy".

These **national pavilions** were true ambassadors for their industries, contributing to SIPSA's international reputation. Their success confirmed the show's central role as a crossroads for exchanges and opportunities for global agriculture.

4- Events on the Sidelines of SIPSA: Food Security at the Heart of the Debates

✓ DJAZAQUA: solutions for food security in Africa

The **2024 DJAZAQUA Forum**, organized alongside SIPSA, Irganized on the sidelines of SIPSA, lived up to its promises by bringing together key players in **aquaculture and fishing in Algeria and Africa**. Strategic themes for the sector's development were addressed. **Mauritania**, **the country of honor at this edition**, made a strong impression with its active participation and the quality of its interventions. Exchanges with the Mauritanian delegation facilitated fruitful contacts and identified promising avenues for cooperation. The commercialization opportunities for seafood in Africa were also at the heart of the discussions, with insights into promising markets and strategies to conquer these outlets. Additionally, the contribution of aquaculture to food security was widely debated, highlighting the important role of this sector in feeding African populations. Beyond the organized panels, the 2024 **DJAZAQUA Forum** offered numerous networking and B2B meeting opportunities. Professionals were able to forge commercial relationships, exchange best practices, and explore potential partnerships.

✓ African agricultural issues, a key theme for politicians

Among the distinguished guests, the official presence of the Mauritanian Minister of Agriculture at this significant event was a highlight of SIPSA, alongside his Sahrawi counterpart, the Minister of Economic Development of the SADR. Similarly, the strong involvement of the African Union Commissioner in charge of agricultural issues contributed to enriching our debates by placing them within a broader agenda.

✓ AFRIKA SIPSA INNOV' AWARDS: Showcasing Fertile Creativity in the Agricultural Sector

The SIPSA innovation competition rewarded four projects. These winners illustrate the diversity of technological solutions proposed to meet today's challenges:

- **1. Voltagaz**: An innovative vision of energy distribution, combining gas and electricity for flexible energy solutions.
- **2. e-Tolbi**: A decision-support tool based on Al and remote sensing to optimize crop management.
- **3. Tec Advisor**: An IoT system automating hydroponic cultivation to optimize yield, resource use and reduce costs.
- **4. VetAndTic**: A digital platform centralizing the veterinary ecosystem, facilitating access to information and products.

These projects demonstrate that innovation is at the heart of SIPSA, propelling Algerian agriculture towards a more sustainable, efficient and connected future.

✓ Pan-African conference: African agricultural leaders meet at SIPSA

The aspiration of the Country's High Authorities towards Africa led SIPSA-Filaha to host this year the first edition of the Pan-African Conference on Food Issues this year. This conference, co-organized by GRFI and ISRA (Senegalese Institute of Agricultural Research- Institut Sénégalais de Recherches Agricoles), provided an opportunity to express the concerns of the agricultural world in the face of geopolitical changes around the world, and called for a joint sub-regional effort to meet the challenges we face. The speakers agreed to meet again in Dakar from October 29th to 31st, 2024, to continue their discussions in the light of the "Algiers Declaration", which outlined the roadmap for a regional dynamic of intellectual and pragmatic consultations around concrete projects to be defined within a common framework for consultation.
